Two teams currently on the outside looking in at the MLS Cup Playoffs face off in a must-win game if either wants to reach the postseason. The New York Red Bulls are currently four points behind fourth-place Kansas City for the last playoff spot – but they have two games in hand over the team closest to them in the Eastern Conference table. The Columbus Crew sit a further three points behind the Red Bulls – a loss on Saturday would leave them seven points in back of the Wizards with just four games remaining for both.

- Columbus last won in New Jersey on April 12, 2003, a span of six games (though three have been played to draws). The Crew haven't won the season series since 2001, when they won both meetings played that season (two were canceled). But they split the series in 2002 and 2004.

- The teams played to a scoreless draw in their first meeting, at Giants Stadium, before the teams split the two meetings in Columbus exactly a month apart.
- In the first meeting this season, Richie Williams saw a familiar result in his first game in charge of the New York Red Bulls, as his team and the Crew played to a scoreless draw at Giants Stadium. Williams was making his debut as interim head coach for the Red Bulls after Mo Johnston was dismissed the day before.
- While the Red Bulls created more chances than they had in any game during the season, it was the Crew who came closest to breaking the deadlock, Joseph Ngwenya's skimming angled shot in the 64th minute beating Red Bulls 'keeper Tony Meola but hitting the base of the left-hand post.

- On July 19 at Crew Stadium, while the Crew had the better of the play in the first half, it was the Red Bulls that opened the scoring five minutes after the restart. Edson Buddle slid an inch-perfect diagonal ball for Chris Henderson to run onto in the left side of the Columbus penalty area, and despite an acute angle, the MLS original knocked the ball between 'keeper Noah Palmer and the post for his 50th career goal.
- Then just before the regulation 90 minutes ticked over, a long clearance was headed on by Jean-Philippe Peguero, and rookie Jerrod Laventure latched onto it. Some 30 yards from goal, he volleyed an audacious chip over a backpedaling Palmer for his first professional goal.
- Jon Conway recorded a clean sheet for the second consecutive week, the first time since 2003 New York had recorded shutouts in back-to-back games and the Crew saw their club-record winless streak reach nine games.

LAST MEETING

- Although both coaches had made their names in coaching rival programs in college soccer, Bruce Arena and Sigi Schmid had never faced each other as professional coaches until the Aug. 19 meeting.
- It looked as if the match would dwindle to a scoreless draw until eight minutes from time, when Chris Leitch launched a long ball down the right flank. Joseph Ngwenya ran onto it and carried to nearly the Red Bulls penalty area before cutting inside defender Carlos Mendes. He then shot between Mendes' legs, leaving Tony Meola flat-footed as the ball slipped inside the near post to give Columbus a first victory since June 3.

NEW YORK RED BULLS

The New York Red Bulls lost for the second consecutive week and saw their winless run extend to three games as their bid for a place in the MLS Cup Playoffs grew a little more distant, dropping a 1-0 decision to the New England Revolution last Saturday at Gillette Stadium. The Red Bulls have 29 points from 26 matches, still four points behind the fourth-place Kansas City Wizards and three points ahead of the last-place Crew.

LAST MATCH

- Pat Noonan wasn't on the field long in his return to the Revolution lineup, but he made it count. The defending Eastern Conference champion had won just once over the past two months, while the visiting Red Bulls also had just one victory in their last six games.
- Noonan had played just six league games since mid-May, missing the last two with another injury, and hadn't scored a goal on the campaign after hitting for 29 in his first three MLS seasons. But in the eighth minute, Steve Ralston put a slide-rule through ball between a pair of Red Bulls defenders, and Noonan ran onto it before curling a shot with the outside of his boot past Jon Conway inside his right post.
- The goal continued a torrid run of form for Noonan against the New York club. In 14 career regular season games, Noonan has scored 11 times. Add in playoff meetings and the tally grows to 14 goals in 18 appearances. But after coming back into the team after being sidelined with a hamstring injury, his return lasted only 18 minutes as he was withdrawn with an injury to his right hip flexor.
- The Red Bulls then saw their hopes go down in flames nine minutes from the end when Amado Guevara was sent off with two cautions in very short order, first for dissent after a foul in midfield, then when appeared to grab referee Brian Hall as he continued to dispute the call.
- Red Bulls head coach Bruce Arena made three changes to the team that lost 2-1 to the Chicago Fire the Sunday before at Toyota Park. Jon Conway came in between the posts for Tony Meola, his first start since a four-match run July 14-29. Danny O'Rourke returned from suspension and Edson Buddle also came back into the team, coming in for Chris Henderson and Todd Dunivant as Arena's reshuffled his lines.

- "Falling behind early today, we made it real difficult on ourselves. We have a young team, but all three of these games, we were in position to get points. Every game we've been in – K.C. was 2-2, in position to get three points there – the next game was a harder game to win given we fell back by two goals, and then today falling behind early and trying to come back."



TEAM NEWS

- Arena was forced into a lineup decision before kickoff when left back Todd Dunivant suffered a strain of his left quadriceps. He had already planned to drop Jeff Parke in central defense, but then Dunivant's absence caused a reshuffle in the back. Dunivant is out for Saturday's game.
- "We had to make a last-minute adjustment when (Todd) Dunivant was pulled out. That made it a bit difficult on ourselves, but we have no excuses," Arena said. "We didn't play well enough to get a win. We made it real difficult on ourselves, we had moments where we played well and other moments where it was really sloppy. We have our next two games at home. We're going to have an opportunity to play at home now, hope to get three points there."
- The Red Bulls now have four of their final six games at home, beginning with the next two – a rematch with the Revolution next Wednesday following the Crew match.
- "We put our backs to the wall," midfielder Dema Kovalenko said. "We have two games at home we have to win. It will be interesting to see what we're made of. Now we have to look to Columbus. It's a must-win. Now, there's no other way. We have to win and if we don't win then we're going to stay home."
- For Jon Conway, it was his first action since starting four consecutive league matches in July – when he allowed just one goal over 360 minutes, recording three consecutive shutouts. The loss to the Revolution was the first with Conway in goal since coming to the Red Bulls; he had seen the team go 4-0-2 when he started between the posts this season.
- "I thought our goalkeeper had an excellent night," Arena said. "Jon made a bunch of big saves when we were pressing, trying to get a goal."
- Still, Arena said he has not made a decision for Saturday. "Both goalies have played well and it made sense to give (Conway) an opportunity (Saturday)," Arena said to the *Newark Star-Ledger*. "It's no discredit to Tony. We discussed being able to use Jon at some point this season and that was a good opportunity for him. Sometimes a home game is a bit of a cop-out in making a goalkeeper change. When you put him in on the road, it's much more challenging and it gives him an opportunity to show where he's at and how he positions himself to compete for the starting position."

COLUMBUS CREW

The Columbus Crew weren't able to build on their victory of the week before, unable to capitalize on a man advantage as the Chicago Fire extended their long unbeaten run with a 2-1 victory at Toyota Park last Sunday evening. The Crew still sit in sixth place in the Eastern Conference with 26 points from 27 matches, three points behind the New York Red Bulls in fifth place and now seven behind the Kansas City Wizards in the final playoff spot in the Eastern Conference.

LAST MATCH

- The Fire hadn't lost in five games in league competition and eight games in all competitions, while the Crew had followed a 13-game winless streak stretching over two months with a pair of wins in three contests.
- The Fire took control of the match with two goals over the final five-plus minutes of the first half. Justin Mapp made a strong run down the right flank and hooked in a low cross that Nate Jaqua side-footed home off the base of the post for his team-leading seventh goal of the campaign (40).
- Then two minutes into first-half stoppage time, Chris Armas whipped in a short corner that C.J. Brown headed home from inside the penalty spot. For Brown, it was his first goal since his first season in 1998, a streak of 201 games without a goal.
- The Fire were left a man down in the 63rd minute when Calen Carr was sent off with a straight red card after his high boot caught the head of Crew defender Rusty Pierce. Then nine minutes later Columbus pulled a goal back when Sebastian Rozental converted from the spot after an attempt by the Chilean from a corner kick was blocked by a handball from Jaqua, but that was as close as they got.
- Crew boss Sigi Schmid made one change to the team that defeated the New England Revolution 3-0 the Saturday before at Crew Stadium. Chad Marshall made his first start since Aug. 16, coming into central defense for Ezra Hendrickson.
- Here's Schmid's team (4-2-3-1): Bill Gaudette – Chris Leitch (Ryan Coiner 68), Marcos Gonzalez, Chad Marshall, Rusty Pierce –Duncan Oughton, Jose Retiz (Ezra Hendrickson 79) – Eddie Gaven, Sebastian Rozental, Ricardo Virtuoso – Jason Garey (Joseph Ngwenya 60). [Substitutes Not Used: Marc Burch, Ned Grabavoy, Andy Gruenebaum, Ritchie Kotschau]
- "Games are always about when a team dominates you need to keep the off the board and when you dominate you need to get on the board. We had a five-minute period at the end of the half where we gave up a couple of goals," said Schmid. "They weren't good goals necessarily, especially on the second one. We gave a corner away when we didn't need to give a corner away. Then, we were very naïve on the way we defended the corner."

TEAM NEWS

- The two goals in the final five-plus minutes of the second half completely changed the game – especially after the Crew didn't start with great energy. "I think the game became difficult when we finished the first half down

2-0. That is the major thing to me," said goal-scorer Sebastian Rozental. "We didn't deserve to go down 2-0. It was very difficult to come back after the first half."

- "At some point, you've got to make history and you've got to change things," Schmid said. "It's not just a Columbus problem. It's a problem in the mentality of all the players in this league. They don't function as well (when they're losing)."
- After the lackluster first half, the Crew came out firing in the second 45 minutes, taking 15 of their total 18 shots in the half. The output was two short of the team high for the season.
- "In the second half we threw everything forward. I don't think the crossing was of the right quality. We had some chances. There were a couple of scrambles inside the box. (The Fire) packed it in pretty well and just defended and we couldn't grab the second goal," Schmid said. "I don't think (Crew goalkeeper) Bill (Gaudette) had anything to do in the second half with the exception of distribute it."
- The loss assured the Crew will have the fewest wins for a season at home in club history. They have three wins in 14 games thus far (with five draws); the previous low was six wins in 2002 and 2003. After the match in New York, they return home for the final two games of the league season at Crew Stadium, before hitting the road to close out the final two games of the campaign.
- "We're down right now, but hopefully we'll talk it over during the week and come out the way we did in the last three games," midfielder Jose Retiz said to *The Columbus Dispatch*. "Nothing is lost right now. We'll get back on track." Said Schmid: "There are still 15 points out there, but you have to gather maximum points. You can't leave points on the table."
- Jason Garey suffered an apparent concussion, forcing him off at the hour mark. "He was wobbling around out there and maybe that's why he didn't take the chances that he could have or should have," Schmid said.
- It was a second start for Ricardo Virtuoso in the Crew midfield, and besides overcoming a hamstring injury, Schmid said the Brazilian is also adapting to the MLS style, more physical that he is used to.
- "He is dribbling in the right parts of the field and has adjusted to the different tempo of the game," Schmid said to *The Columbus Dispatch*. "It makes you feel good to know that if you can put him on one wing and put Jacob Thomas on the other, that is going to cause opposing coaches a sleepless night or two." However, Thomas missed a fourth consecutive match with a torn calf muscle.
- While there is a sense of rebuilding with the Crew, there is also the acknowledgement that the club does not again want to miss out on the postseason for a second consecutive season after winning the MLS Supporters' Shield just two years ago.
- "There are a lot of guys getting a lot of experience and a lot of battle scars and they're thrown in the fire right now," Schmid said. "Hopefully, that bodes well for the future, but right now we're not thinking about that. We're thinking about this season. We need to get points this year."

Red Bulls Notes:

UP NEXT, COLUMBUS: Tonight, the Red Bulls face a must-win situation when they battle Eastern Conference foe, the Columbus Crew. The Red Bulls come home after a three-game road swing versus Eastern Conference opponents.

New York (29 points) is still in striking distance of a playoff spot, just four points behind Kansas City (33) with

two games in hand over the Wizards. The Red Bulls will be able to control their destiny for the remainder of the season, with five of their six final matches being against Eastern Conference teams.

Columbus most recently dropped a 2-1 decision to Chicago last Saturday. After the Crew fell behind through Nate Jaqua and C.J. Brown first half goals, Sebastian Rozental pulled them within one from the penalty spot. The Crew, however, pulled off a surprising upset a week before, when it bulldozed past New England, 3-0.

The Red Bulls are 1-1-0 against the Crew this season. After tying with them 0-0 on June 28, New York earned its first road win of the season on July 19 at Crew Stadium, taking a 2-0 decision. However, Columbus earned its revenge on August 19 at Crew Stadium when a Joseph Ngwenya strike eight minutes from full time earned Columbus a 1-0 victory.

CREW CONNECTIONS: **Edson Buddle** spent the first five years of his MLS career in Columbus, appearing in 106 games for the Crew. He was traded to New York on March 28 for **Eddie Gaven**, who was with NY for his first three seasons, and the rights to defender **Chris Leitch**, who played three seasons on New York's backline. This marks Leitch's second go-round with Columbus, having been drafted by the Crew in the fourth round of the 2002 MLS SuperDraft.

Midfielder **Chris Henderson** appeared in 21 games for the Crew in 2005 before being dealt to New York on January 12, 2006 in exchange for defender **Tim Ward**. Henderson has scored three goals and assisted on another in 26 games for the Red Bulls this year.

Red Bulls forward **John Wolyniec** was traded from New York to Columbus on June 7, 2005 for current Chivas USA forward **Ante Razov**. Wolyniec played in 17 games for the Crew in 2005 and was then traded to Los Angeles before rejoining the Red Bulls on August 17, 2006.

Crew defender **Ezra Hendrickson** played in eight games for New York during the 1998 season and Crew goalkeeper Jonny Walker saw action in 42 games between the pipes for New York in 2003 through 2005.

In addition to the playing connections, Red Bulls midfielders **Danny O'Rourke** and **Seth Stammler** both reside in Columbus during the offseason and Crew midfielder **Danny Szetela** grew up in nearby Clifton, NJ.

REVS MOTOR PAST BULLS: A Pat Noonan 8th minute goal was enough for the New England Revolution to

edge past New York, 1-0, on Saturday, September 9, at Gillette Stadium.

Noonan was able to get by his defender and strike the ball past goalkeeper Jon Conway, who made seven saves. Amado Guevara picked up two cautions with the second coming in the 81st minute, meaning he will miss the team's next match against Columbus on Saturday, September 16. Edson Buddle led the team with four shots.

RED BULL SALZBURG UPDATE: A brief update on how Red Bull New York's sister club, Red Bull Salzburg, is doing so far in its 2006-2007 campaign:

- Red Bull Salzburg is in first place in the Austrian Bundesliga after a 1-1 draw with Rapid Vienna on Sunday, September 10. Their record in 2006/2007 – 5-0-3. Here is how they stand:

BONA-VIDE: On Sunday, September 3 against Chicago, midfielder Joe Vide made his first start of his young career. Vide played into the 89th minute before being taken out for fellow rookie Blake Camp.

Due to his strong performance against Chicago, Vide earned his second consecutive start against New England on September 9, where he played 62 minutes before being replaced by Chris Henderson.

Vide, a University of Virginia product, was drafted by New York in the first round, fifth overall, of the 2006 MLS Supplemental Draft.

CONWAY RETURNS: Goaltender Jon Conway made his first start since July 29 (1-1 tie at Houston) in New York's 1-0 loss to New England on Saturday, September 9, making seven saves. The defeat was Conway's first in 2006 as he is now 4-1-2 this season.

He was an important part of a Red Bulls' four-game unbeaten run (3-0-1) in July – a streak that included three shutouts. Conway did not allow a goal in 340 minutes (a run that ended vs. Houston on July 29) and this is the second-longest shutout streak in MLS in 2006.

The longest streak is Los Angeles' Kevin Hartman at 521 minutes.

Conway, a 1999 Rutgers graduate, was acquired by New York on December 5, 2005 in exchange for a natural fourth round pick in the 2006 SuperDraft.

Prior to joining the Red Bulls, Conway spent five seasons with San Jose (now Houston), where he played in 18 total games, boasting a 1.51 GAA.

HOME COOKING: With their 6-0 win against Real Salt Lake on Saturday, August 26, the Red Bulls are now 5-2-5 at Giants Stadium this season. They are now unbeaten in their last seven (4-0-3) in Giants Stadium. Four of the Red Bulls' remaining six games are at home.

GUEVARA SUSPENDED: Midfielder Amado Guevara will miss the Red Bulls' next game on September 16 against Columbus after being ejected from the Red Bulls' 1-0 loss to New England on September 9. Guevara picked up his second yellow card in the 81st minute just a minute after he picked up his first.

Midfielder Mike Magee and defenders Jeff Parke and Carlos Mendes are "on warning." If Magee or Mendes pick up another yellow card within the next three MLS games they play, they will be suspended one match. Parke will be suspended if he picks up a caution within the next two games.

ALTIDORE MAKES MLS DEBUT: 16-year-old Josmer Altidore made his MLS league debut when he came on for Danny O'Rourke in the 81st minute during the Red Bulls 1-0 loss to New England on September 9 at Gillette Stadium. Altidore made his first team debut against D.C. United on August 23 during the quarterfinal round of the U.S. Open Cup.

THREE'S COMPANY: After managing to tally one goal in 11 games with the Los Angeles Galaxy and Columbus Crew, John Wolyniec had found a groove in New York. The Staten Island product has racked up a goal in each of his first three games as a Red Bull starter.

Wolyniec came on as a sub in his first two New York appearances this season before being inserted into the starting lineup against Real Salt Lake, a game in which he had a goal and two assists.

CAMP FIRE: Midfielder Blake Camp made his MLS debut on Sunday, September 3, when he came on in the 89th minute for Joe Vide during the Red Bulls' 2-1 loss to the Chicago Fire.

Camp, a Duke University product drafted in the fourth round of the 2006 MLS SuperDraft, has scored three

goals and added an assist in nine reserve matches for New York.

ALTIDORE, ARVIZU PARTICIPATE IN U-20 TOURNAMENT: Forwards Josmer Altidore and David Arvizu were called up by U.S. U-20 head coach Thomas Rongen on Tuesday, August 22 for the Busan International U-20 Four Nationals Tournament from Aug. 29 to Sept. 2 in Busan, South Korea.

Altidore started in each of the squad's three games and scored a 14th minute goal in the U.S.' final match – a 3-1 win over Argentina. Arvizu started in two of the three games and came on as a substitute in the team's second game – a 1-0 loss to Slovakia.

Altidore also played with the U-20's on Tuesday, July 25 in Northern Ireland, participating in the 2006 Milk Cup. Altidore, who was one of five MLS players asked to participate, played in two of the three U.S. games and helped the team to the final.

Arvizu, 18, has not made a first team appearance for the Red Bulls thus far in 2006, but has played in eight reserve games, scoring two goals.

N.Y. EARNS POINT AT K.C.: Though John Wolyniec and Todd Dunivant were able to put the Red Bulls up 2-1, a Josh Wolff 71st minute equalizer ensured a 2-2 tie between New York and the Kansas City Wizards on Wednesday, August 30. Scott Sealy put the hosts ahead in the 28th minute.

New York had two games in hand on Kansas City and seven out of their last eight matches are against Eastern Conference opponents.

2-FOR-2: Forward John Wolyniec and defender Todd Dunivant scored their second goal in as many games against Kansas City on Wednesday, August 30 in a 2-2 draw.

For Wolyniec, he made his first start since being acquired by the Red Bulls from the Los Angeles Galaxy on August 26 against Real Salt Lake and made an immediate impact, tallying a goal and two assists. Against the Wizards, Wolyniec was able to latch onto an Amado Guevara cross and tally his third goal of the season in the 30th minute.

After failing to score in 95 league games, Dunivant also found the back of the net for the second-straight game, heading in a Yuri Djorkaeff cross. He broke his scoreless drought against Real Salt Lake on August 26 in the Red Bulls' 6-0 win.

CAPTAIN GUEVARA: A two-assist performance by captain Amado Guevara helped the Red Bulls beat Real Salt Lake, 6-0, on Saturday, August 26. Four-days later against Kansas City, Guevara earned another assist on John Wolyniec's 30th minute goal.

The Red Bulls are 4-3-3 when Guevara wears the captain's armband.

BULLS SIX-PACK SALT LAKE: The Red Bulls ran rampant on a 10-man Real Salt Lake on Saturday, Aug. 26, as they tallied six second-half goals on route to a 6-0 win over the Western Conference side at Giants Stadium. Forward Edson Buddle tallied a hat trick while John Wolyniec, Todd Dunivant and Jordan Cila all put their names on the scoresheet after Jack Stewart was handed a red card just eight minutes into the match.

The result produced a number of team and MLS records:

- The six goals tied a New York record for most goals scored in a game. The other time New York did it was exactly six years prior – on Aug. 26, 2000 in a 6-4 win over Dallas.
- The Red Bulls tied the record for the most goals in a half in MLS history with six. The other time this happened was on Oct. 26, 2003, when Columbus beat Chicago, 6-2. The all-time MLS record for goals in a game is eight.
- However, New York scored the fastest six goals ever scored by one team in an MLS match (32 minutes). The previous record was 41 minutes by the Crew in their win over the Fire in 2003.
- New York snapped a 233-minute scoreless streak under head coach Bruce Arena.
- Arena's MLS teams have now outscored their opponents 18-2 when playing a man-up.

The game also marked several firsts:

- It was Arena's first win since he took the helm as Red Bull New York's Sporting Director and Head Coach.
- Defender Todd Dunivant (79th minute) and forward Jordan Cila (77th minute) scored their first league goals in Red Bull uniform. For Dunivant, it was his first and only goal since his first-ever MLS game on April 12, 2003, when he scored for the then-San Jose Earthquakes. Dunivant also earned his first point as a Red Bull earlier in the night, assisting on Edson Buddle's 54th minute goal. Cila also scored a goal for the Red Bulls in the U.S. Open Cup on August 2 at Wilmington.
- Forward John Wolyniec made his first start in his fourth stint as a Red Bull since he was acquired on Aug. 17, 2006 from Los Angeles for a pair of

draft picks. He earned a goal and a pair of assists against Real Salt Lake. His goal was his first for New York since May 31, 2005. His last MLS start came with the Galaxy on June 24, 2006 in a 0-0 tie with the Houston Dynamo.

- After going 0-0-3 against Real, New York earned its first-ever win against Salt Lake.

BUDDLE BREAKS OUT: Despite the fact that his streak of 13 straight league starts ended against Real Salt Lake on Aug. 26, forward Edson Buddle had a notable impact in the Red Bulls' 6-0 win. Buddle scored three goals in the second half within 18 minutes after he came on at halftime for Chris Henderson. It is only the third hat trick in all of MLS in 2006 and second New York hat trick this season.

For his efforts, Buddle was named MLS Player of the Week for Week 22 and won Sierra Mist Goal of the Week for his second goal – a header off a Marvell Wynne cross.

The first of his goals, in the 54th minute, snapped a 754-minute scoreless streak for Buddle (his last goal came on July 1 at New England). Buddle is now the Red Bulls' leading scorer with six. He has averaged almost 10 goals in the past four seasons.

It was Buddle's second hat trick his career with his first coming against New York, while he was a member of the Columbus Crew (Sept. 18, 2004, 4-2 CLB win). Worth note is that he scored four goals in that game. The hat trick was New York's second of the season, as former Red Bull Jean Philippe Peguero scored three to lead the team past Chivas USA, 5-4, on May 20, 2006 at Giants Stadium.

HATS OFF: On August 26, against Real Salt Lake, New York forward Edson Buddle became just the seventh player in New York history to notch a hat trick. New York's record improved to 7-1-1 when a player has tallied three or more goals in a single game.

CLOSING IN ON 50: The goals against Salt Lake on August 26 were Buddle's 46th, 47th and 48th of his career. At 25 years, 101 days old as of Wednesday,

August 30, Buddle should become the fourth youngest player to reach the 50-goal-plateau in MLS history.

SHUTOUT RECORD REACHES 62: Goalkeeper Tony Meola made two saves, recording his 62nd career shutout against Real Salt Lake in a 6-0 win on Saturday, Aug. 26, and adding to his MLS record for most shutouts by a goalkeeper. It was his second-consecutive league shutout with the first coming against D.C. United on Aug. 16 (0-0 draw at Giants Stadium). In that game, it was also the first shutout notched on United, the highest scoring MLS team statistically at the time, in 2006.

The match against D.C. also marked Meola's first MLS start since July 8, when the team fell 2-1 at FC Dallas. Meola had been battling a bacterial infection in his right foot/ankle.

BULLS FALL IN OPEN CUP: A pair of Jamil Walker goals led D.C. United past the Red Bulls, 3-1, on Wednesday, August 23 in the quarterfinals of the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup.

Though New York controlled the first half at RFK Stadium, Josh Gros put the hosts up in front, before Amado Guevara scored his all-time franchise-leading fifth career U.S. Open goal.

The Red Bulls advanced to the quarterfinals after defeating USL Second Division's Wilmington Hammerheads on Wednesday, August 2, 2-1.

New York's best finish in the Open Cup was in 2003, when it made the finals before losing to Chicago, 1-0. New York is now 1-1 against United in Open Cup competition. They first played on October 1, 2003 at Rutgers University's Yurcak Field during the tournament's semifinals. A Guevara brace and a John Wolyniec 88th minute on that night was enough for New York to win, 3-2.

LISI, KUYKENDALL OUT FOR YEAR: Midfielders Mark Lisi and Shawn Kuykendall were both placed on the team's Season Ending Injury list on Thursday, August 24. Lisi- the longest tenured player on the Red Bulls- suffered a right groin injury while Kuykendall tore his left ACL.

CREW SNAPS BULLS' STREAK: A Joseph Ngwenya 82nd minute goal was enough for the Columbus Crew to snap a 13-game winless streak and the Red Bulls' five game unbeaten run (3-0-2), as New York fell 1-0 at Crew Stadium on Saturday, August 19.

If it earned a result against Columbus on Saturday, it would have been the longest unbeaten run for the team since the 2003 season, when New York went 5-0-2 between April 19 and May 31. It was broken at Kansas City on June 7, when they lost 2-1 to the Wizards.

Their last five-game unbeaten run came in 2005, when between August 14 to September 17, New York went 3-0-2 before falling at New England, 1-0, on September 24, 2006.

WOLY RETURNS HOME: Red Bull New York announced on August 17, 2006 that they have acquired forward John Wolyniec from the Los Angeles Galaxy in exchange for a fourth round draft pick in 2007 and a second round draft pick in 2008. The Staten Island, NY native had tallied one goal in 10 appearances with the Galaxy in 2006.

He made his Red Bulls' debut when he came on for Edson Buddle in the 80th minute during the team's 1-0 loss to the Columbus Crew on August 19.

ARENA BALL: Red Bull New York Sporting Director and Head Coach Bruce Arena made his official MLS debut for the Red Bulls on Wednesday, August 16 when the team played to a 0-0 draw against his former squad, D.C. United. It was the first match that Arena has coached in MLS since the 1998 MLS Cup final on October 25, 1998, when United, lost to Chicago 2-0. It is also Arena's first MLS tie ever (when he was last coaching in MLS, games went to overtime shootouts).

The Red Bulls' international friendly against FC Barcelona on August 12 marked Arena's official debut. The former U.S. Men's National Team Manager was hired by Red Bull New York on Tuesday, July 18. The winningest coach in U.S. soccer history, Arena led the Americans to a surprising quarterfinal finish at the 2002 World Cup, highlighted by wins over Mexico and Portugal.

Before joining the U.S. Squad in October of 1998, Arena was the head coach of MLS side D.C. United from 1995-1998 and won two MLS Cups in 1996 and 1997.

One of the greatest all-time coaches at the college level, Arena won five national titles and recorded 295 wins during his 18-year tenure as the top man at the University of Virginia.

KUYKENDALL UNDERGOES SURGERY: Midfielder Shawn Kuykendall underwent surgery Wednesday, August 16, to repair a torn medial meniscus and anterior cruciate ligament in his left knee – an injury he sustained during a training session the week before. He is anticipated to miss six months.

DEMA-LITION DERBY: Newly-acquired midfielder Dema Kovalenko made his first MLS start with the Red Bulls on Wednesday, August 16, when he started against D.C. United and played the entire 90 minutes in a 0-0 tie with the conference leaders.

RISING STOCK: Red Bulls Amado Guevara, Todd Dunivant and Taylor Graham and assistant coach Des McAleenan rang the opening bell at the NASDAQ Stock Market on Thursday, August 18.

BARCA BEATS BULLS IN FRONT OF SELLOUT: Two goals by reigning FIFA World Player of the Year Ronaldinho was enough for Barcelona to defeat the Red Bulls in front of a sellout crowd of 79,002 at Giants Stadium on Saturday, August 12. Lionel Messi and Javier Saviola scored Barcelona's other two goals while Youri Djorkaeff tallied a first-half strike for New York.

The attendance was just three shy of the record for the soccer game at Giants Stadium when Manchester United beat Juventus, 4-1, on July 31, 2003 (79,005). The Red Bulls-Barcelona game also marked the largest crowd at Giants Stadium for both a New York and MLS game.

The largest-ever event in Giants Stadium was on October 5, 1995 (a Pope John Paul II mass – 82,948). Giants Stadium's official capacity is 80,242.

YOURI MAKES RETURN: After missing over a month of time due to personal reasons, midfielder Youri Djorkaeff made his return to the Red Bulls against Barcelona on August 12, starting and playing 59 minutes before being substituted for Mike Magee. Djorkaeff scored against the Catalan giants after poking the ball in from short range off an Edson Buddle deflected shot. In MLS action, Djorkaeff has two goals and three assists in 14 games.

RBNY SIGNS KOVALENKO: Red Bull New York announced on Thursday, August 10, that they have acquired midfielder Dema Kovalenko from D.C. United in exchange for a partial allocation.

Kovalenko, 28, is a seven-year veteran of MLS, spending four years with the Chicago Fire (1999-2002) and three with D.C. United (2003-2005) prior to enjoying a brief stint back at home in his native Ukraine with FC Metalurh Zaporizhya in 2006. Amassing 34 goals and 34 assists in 167 appearances for Chicago and D.C., he

was one of the key players in United's 2004 MLS Cup run, starting in 26 regular season games.

Born in Kiev, Ukraine, Kovalenko spent three years at Indiana University (1996-1998) where he won a national championship in his final year there.

HARKES NAMED ASSISTANT COACH: Red Bull New York announced Monday, July 31 that former U.S. Men's National Team standout John Harkes has been named Assistant Coach.

Harkes, a Kearny, NJ native, made 90 appearances with the U.S. Team from 1987-1999 and was a starting midfielder in both the 1990 and 1994 FIFA World Cups. A veteran of 167 Major League Soccer matches, Harkes helped lead D.C. United to back-to-back MLS Cup championships in 1996 and 1997, while playing for current Red Bulls head coach Bruce Arena. He was elected to the National Soccer Hall of Fame in 2005.

Harkes also played under Arena at the University of Virginia from 1985-1987.

INTERNATIONAL SUCCESS: While the Red Bulls fell to FC Barcelona on August 12, 4-1, they have been successful in international friendly competitions. Since February 29, 2004, New York is 6-1-3 in 10 matches.

RED BULLS FEATURED IN VANITY FAIR: Six members of the New York Red Bulls - midfielders Danny O'Rourke and Seth Stammers, defenders Steve Jolley and Jeff Parke, forward Jordan Cila, and goalkeeper Mike Behonick - are featured in a two-page photo spread in the September 2006 issue of *Vanity Fair* magazine.

The players are sporting mohawks and camouflage army-surplus fashion designed by Junya Watanabe. Watanabe's fall men's-wear collection, which was inspired by Robert De Niro's character in the 1972 film *Taxi Driver*, was modeled by the Red Bulls in a street scene that mirrored the setting of the movie.

UNBEATEN STREAK REACHES FOUR: The Red Bulls extended their current unbeaten streak to four games with a 1-1 tie at Houston on July 29. The game's

outcome was decided in a three-minute span in the second half during which Chris Henderson's third goal of the season was canceled out by a Dwayne De Rosario penalty kick. The tie kept New York in third place in the Eastern Conference.

PEGUERO SOLD TO BRONDBY: Red Bull New York announced Saturday, July 29 that forward Jean Philippe Peguero has been transferred to Danish club Brondby. Per MLS policy, terms of the transfer will not be disclosed.

Peguero was the Red Bulls' leading scorer, finding the back of the net six times this season. His most notable game in 2006 was New York's 5-4 win over Chivas USA at Giants Stadium on May 20, when he notched a hat trick and an assist. For that effort, he was the MLS Player of the Week for Week 8.

ROLLING ON: Mike Magee's third goal of the year in the 25th minute was enough for New York to overcome the Kansas City Wizards, 1-0, at Giants Stadium on Saturday, July 22. The win moved the Red Bulls up to third place, two points ahead of Chicago and just two behind the New England Revolution.

Goalkeeper Jon Conway also posted his fourth win of the season and third consecutive shutout. The only other time in New York history in which it earned three consecutive shutout wins was in 1996, when they felled Dallas in an overtime shootout, 0-0 (6/19), beat Kansas City, 2-0 (6/26) and defeated Columbus, 4-0 (6/30).

The last time New York registered three consecutive wins was in 2004 (7/24 - 2-1 win vs. Chicago ; 7/28 - 2-1 win at Kansas City ; 8/8 - 3-0 win vs. Los Angeles).

MOVING ON UP: The Red Bulls' 2-0 defeat of Columbus on Wednesday, July 19 removed several monkeys off the team's collective back. It marked the first time this season that New York won away from Giants Stadium (1-4-4) as well as the first victory over an Eastern Conference opponent (1-3-5).

In addition, the Red Bulls recorded back-to-back shutouts for the first time in more than three years (1-0 vs. Colorado, 2-0 at Columbus). New York last accomplished that feat with games on May 10, 2003 (1-0 win over D.C.) and May 17, 2003 (2-0 win at COL).

SUPER SUB: Jerrod Laventure entered the match at Columbus on July 19 in the 85th minute and promptly scored the first goal of his MLS career just five minutes later. Laventure volleyed a looping ball over the head of Crew goalkeeper Noah Palmer to give New York a 2-0 victory.

MILESTONE AFTER MILESTONE: In his 303rd MLS match, midfielder Chris Henderson scored the 50th goal of his decorated career in the second half of New York's 2-0 win against Columbus on July 19. Henderson, the league's all-time leader in games played, received a through-ball from Edson Buddle on the left flank and beat goaltender Noah Palmer.

BULLS EARN FIRSTS IN WIN OVER RAPIDS: After starting out 0-3-1 as the Red Bulls interim head coach, Richie Williams earned his first win when his team defeated the Colorado Rapids, 1-0, on Friday, July 14.

Also, with the team going 16 games and 1,475 minutes without having a penalty kick in 2006, the Red Bulls earned their first opportunity against the Rapids when Chris Henderson was taken down in the box by Eric Denton. Amado Guevara stepped up and buried it in the 35th minute.

It was the Red Bulls' first win since June 17, when it defeated the Los Angeles, 2-1, at Giants Stadium. And for goaltender Jon Conway, who stepped in for regular Tony Meola, the result marked his first shutout in 2006.

BUDDLE BOOST: In the 24th minute, forward Edson Buddle scored his third goal of the season against the New England Revolution on July 1 with a spectacular individual effort. Taking the ball in the midfield, Buddle beat several Revolution defenders before knocking a shot from an acute angle into the net. The goal was voted on as the Sierra Mist Goal of the Week. Buddle also notched his first assist of the season on Mike Magee's first goal of the season in game's the second half.

JOHNSTON RELIEVED OF HEAD COACHING DUTIES: Red Bull New York Managing Director Marc de Grandpre announced Tuesday, June 27 that the team has relieved Mo Johnston of his head coaching duties effective immediately. Assistant coach Richie Williams was named the interim head coach and compiled a 3-3-2 league record before new head coach Bruce Arena took over on August 12.

RED BULL IRONMEN REACH NEW HEIGHTS: This season, three members of the New York Red Bulls are reaching rarefied air for players in Major League Soccer. Goalkeeper Tony Meola, defender Steve Jolley, and midfielder Chris Henderson have a combined 29 years in MLS and are all reaching impressive milestones while with the Red Bulls.

Meola, the league's all-time leader in saves (1,134), played his 10,000th minute as a goalkeeper in a New York uniform against Kansas City on June 3. He has now played in 11,233 minutes in his two stints with the franchise. Meola is second on New York's all-time minutes played list to only Mike Petke (11,520).

In his career with the Wizards and New York, he has played 22,556 minutes.

Like Meola, Jolley is also in his second go-round with the New York franchise. During the match against Chicago on June 25, Jolley played his 10,000th minute in a New York uniform. He has now appeared in 119 games with the club, surpassing Tab Ramos for third on the club's all-time list behind Meola (124) and Petke (134).

QUICK STRIKES: In the Red Bulls' win over Los Angeles, New York scored goals 1:09 apart with tallies by Edson Buddle and Jean Philippe Peguero in the 27th and 28th minutes, respectively, on June 17. There have only been two other instances in club history when New York players have scored two goals just one minute apart.

On May 27, 2000, Clint Mathis and Steve Jolley found the back of the net in the 34th and 35th minutes in a 4-1 win over Chicago at Giants Stadium. And, on August 18, 1998, Giovanni Savarese scored goals in the 88th and 89th minutes also in a 4-1 win against Colorado at Giants Stadium.

Additionally, Los Angeles' Herculez Gomez opened the game's scoring in the 25th minute – just two minutes before the Red Bulls' goal flurry.

FAST START: Former Red Bulls forward Jean Philippe Peguero's 2nd minute goal on June 10 against the Houston Dynamo was tied for the fastest goal scored in team history. Peguero collided with Dynamo goalkeeper Pat Onstad while chasing down a long ball and collected himself in time to slip the ball across the goal line.

The other fastest was a Clint Mathis tally during the same minute for New York on Sept. 5, 2002.

GOOD SHOWING IN FRIENDLY: On Saturday, May 27, the New York Red Bulls hosted Bayern Munich, the champions of the German Bundesliga, in an international

friendly at Giants Stadium. Despite falling behind early, New York rallied to a 4-2 victory on the strength of a two-goal game by former New York forward Jean Philippe Peguero.

RED BULL NY: On Thursday, March 9th it was announced that Red Bull Company Limited, the Austrian company that produces the world's leading energy drink, finalized an agreement to purchase the MetroStars of Major League Soccer and partner with AEG on the construction of the team's soccer-specific stadium in Harrison, NJ. With the purchase, the team was re-branded immediately as "Red Bull New York," including a new logo, uniforms and team colors.

Red Bull's agreement with AEG (the team's former investor-operator) was approved by the MLS Board of Governors on March 9th, and included the two companies joining together to invest in the custom-built stadium for the team in Harrison. As part of the agreement, Red Bull also purchased naming rights to the soccer-specific stadium. 2005 REGULAR SEASON NEWS AND NOTES

SIGI SCHMID TO LEAD CREW

On October 20, 2005 The Crew announced that the organization has named Sigi Schmid its fourth head coach in club history. Schmid signed a multi-year contract.

The Crew relieved former head coach Greg Andrulis of his duties on July 12 and named assistant coach Robert Warzycha interim head coach. Warzycha led the team to a 7-6-3 record, as Columbus ended the year with an 11-16-5 (38 pts.) record, finishing sixth in the Eastern Conference and missing the playoffs for the third time in team history.

The 52-year-old Schmid joins The Crew after spending the last year as the head coach of the United States Under-20 National Team. Prior to leading the U-20's, Schmid was head coach of Los Angeles from 1999 through August 2004. He was relieved of his duties in L.A. while the team was in first place and had the best record in the league.

Schmid is a proven winner and is one of the most successful coaches in Major League Soccer and NCAA Men's Division I history. He led the Galaxy to a 2002 MLS Cup title, a 2001 U.S. Open Cup Championship and a 2000 CONCACAF Champions Cup. Under his guidance, L.A. also advanced to two additional MLS Cup finals (1999 and 2001) and captured three regular season conference championships (1999, 2001 and 2002), while compiling a 79-53-32 regular season record and a 16-7-3 mark in the playoffs. Heading into the 2006 season his .579 winning percentage ranked fifth all-time in MLS history and his 79 wins ranked sixth, just four wins behind Thomas Rongen in second. He was the 1999 MLS Coach of the Year. Before joining the Galaxy in 1999, Schmid was head coach at UCLA for 19 years and led the Bruins to three NCAA titles (1985, 1990 and 1997), an overall record of 322-63-33 and 17 consecutive playoff appearances. His .810 winning percentage also ranks fifth all-time in NCAA Men's Division I history. He was the 1997 College Coach of the Year. His coaching experience also includes 13 years as a coach for the U.S. Soccer Federation at various levels, including assistant coach on the 1994 U.S. Men's World Cup team. As U-20 head coach, he led the 2005 squad to an 11th-place finish at the 2005 World Youth Championship in Holland, including a group play win over eventual world champion Argentina. Other U.S. Soccer coaching positions include U-20 head coach from 1998-99 and a 12th-place finish at the 1999 World Youth Championships, assistant coach on the 1995 U.S. Pan American Team, U.S. Men's National Team assistant coach (1992-94), assistant coach for the U.S. team at the 1991 World University Games, and assistant coach for the U.S. Men's "B" National Team (1989-91).

Schmid played at UCLA where he received his degree in Economics in 1976. He also obtained his MBA from the University of Southern California in 1978.

SIGI ONE WIN FROM SECOND ALL-TIME IN MLS FOR WINS, SEVENTH ALL-TIME IN MLS FOR WINNING PERCENTAGE

Crew Head Coach Sigi Schmid sits third all-time in MLS history for wins at 85 after The Crew's 3-0 win vs. New England on 9/2. He is one behind former Kansas City coach Bob Gansler with 86 wins. Current Chivas USA coach Bob Bradley is the all-time leader with 122 wins. Schmid has a winning percentage of .550, which ranks seventh all-time in MLS history.

ROZENTAL NOTCHES THIRD GOAL OF THE YEAR, ALL PK'S

Midfielder Sebastian Rozental tallied his third goal of the year in The Crew's 2-1 loss to Chicago on 9/9. All three of his goals have come via penalty kick.

SIX PLAYERS MISS 9/9 GAME VS. CHICAGO WITH INJURIES, FOUR ARE OUT FOR THE SEASON

The Crew had six players out injured for the 9/9 game vs. Chicago. The players that missed the game were Jon Busch (season-ending right ACL), Jed Zayner (season-ending left ACL), Jonny Walker (season-ending back), Frankie Hejduk (season-ending right ACL), Danny Szetela (right knee) and Jacob Thomas (left calf).

THE CREW HAS ALREADY LOST 210 PLAYER GAMES DUE TO INJURY THROUGH 27 GAMES PLAYED

Through 27 games played this season, The Crew has lost 210 player games due to injuries. The 210 games lost to injury averages 7.78 player games lost per game. Four players are out for the season.

WARZYCHA AND WIFE, ELIZA, BECOME U.S. CITIZENS

On Sept. 12, Crew assistant coach Robert Warzycha and his wife, Eliza, were sworn in as United States citizens. The Warzycha's are natives of Poland.

CREW RECOGNIZED AT MONDAY'S COLUMBUS CITY COUNCIL MEETING

Columbus City Council Member Patsy Thomas, Chair of the Public Utilities Committee, introduced a Resolution of Expression at Monday's (Sept. 11) council meeting recognizing and expressing appreciation to the Crew organization for its support of and involvement with the City of Columbus' Keep Columbus Beautiful program.

The Crew's community partnership with Keep Columbus Beautiful has included neighborhood cleanups involving the entire team and the Crew Soccer Foundation rewarding young people who participate in any KCB cleanup, or otherwise volunteer their time or talents to support its efforts, with a complimentary Crew ticket through its Kicks for Kids program. Keep Columbus Beautiful is a City of Columbus community-improvement program that is a unique arm of the Refuse Collection Division of the Columbus Department of Public Service. The award-winning program's mission is to promote and coordinate litter cleanups, graffiti prevention and removal, recycling, and beautification projects.

TITAN AUTO INSURANCE COPA VICTORIA TOURNAMENT MOVES TO QUARTERS

The Titan Auto Insurance Copa Victoria, the Crew's annual adult Hispanic soccer tournament, has reached the quarterfinal stage. In fact, those four matches were scheduled to be played on Saturday, Sept. 9, but field conditions necessitated that they be rescheduled for this Saturday, Sept. 16.

Two games will kick off at 2:30 p.m. on Saturday and two more at 4:30 p.m. at the Crew Training Center at Obetz (4153 Alum Creek Drive). The winners of those matches will face off in the semifinals on Saturday, Sept. 23, at 2:30 p.m. The final is scheduled for Saturday, Sept. 30, at Crew Stadium, prior to the Crew's regular-season home finale. GAUDETTE NOTCHES HIS THIRD SHUTOUT OF THE YEAR, FOURTH OVERALL

Goalkeeper Bill Gaudette notched his third shutout of the year in The Crew's 3-0 win over New England on 9/2. It was his fourth career shutout. Gaudette is 2-4-2 on the year and has a 1.25 goals against average, which ranks tied for sixth in MLS.

NGWENYA SCORES, HELPS CREW BREAK WINLESS STREAK

Joseph Ngwenya tallied the games lone goal in the 82nd minute to help The Crew break its 13-game winless streak by topping New York 1-0 at home on 8/19. It was his third goal of the season and his seventh of his career.

KAMARA BECOMES A U.S. CITIZEN

On Aug. 25, rookie Kei Kamara was sworn in as a United States citizen. The Sierra Leone native moved to Gambia at the age of 14 and then to the U.S. when he was 16 as a political refugee after growing up in the war-torn country. Kamara turned 22 on Sept. 1.

OUGHTON MAKES SUCCESSFUL RETURN, WEARS CAPTAINS ARMBAND

In The Crew's 1-0 win over New York on 8/19, midfielder Duncan Oughton played in his first MLS game since Oct. 31, 2004. Not only was it his first action in just under two years, but Crew coach Sigi Schmid bestowed the captain's armband on him.

The Crew announced on Aug. 18 that it waived Croatian midfielder Leo Bisaku and resigned New Zealander and former Crew veteran Duncan Oughton. Oughton was waived on May 12 after The Crew had acquired Joseph Ngwenya in a trade from Los Angeles and needed to clear an international slot. Bisaku was signed on April 4 and appeared in seven games for Columbus, starting four, and tallied one goal.

Oughton is a six-year Crew veteran but hadn't played for Columbus since injuring his right knee in The Crew's final playoff game vs. New England on Oct. 31, 2004. He had his initial surgery in early November of 2004 and re-injured the right knee prior to the start of the 2005 season while continuing to rehabilitate from his injury. The New Zealand native underwent successful cartilage transplant surgery on his right knee on June 3, 2005 and missed the entire 2005 season. He has still been training with The Crew after being waived and has appeared in some reserve games for the club. Oughton has appeared in 91 regular season games for The Crew, starting 68, and has six goals and two assists. He also has started seven playoff matches.

NEW LOOK CREW

Since Sigi Schmid has taken over The Crew coaching reins the club has made 27 separate player transactions, not including the MLS SuperDraft and MLS Supplemental Draft. Those 27 deals have brought 18 new players to the team. Columbus also added nine players via the two drafts for a total of 27 new players in over seven months on the job (Joel Kitamirike, Dayton O'Brien and Leo Bisaku have since been waived, Duke Hashimoto traded, and David Chun decided to not play). Only seven players remain from last year's opening season roster and one that was acquired during last year.

FIVE PLAYERS HAVE WORN THE CAPTAIN'S ARM BAND THIS SEASON

Five different Crew players have worn the captain's arm band this season. The five to wear the captain's arm band this season are Ritchie Kotschau (17 games), Jon Busch (2), Frankie Hejduk (3), Rusty Pierce (1) and Duncan Oughton (4).

CREW RESERVES FALL 3-2 TO CHICAGO RESERVES ON SUNDAY

The Columbus Crew Reserves had their two-game winning streak snapped after dropping a 3-2 decision to the Chicago Fire Reserves on Sunday, Sept. 10, at The Crew's training facility in Obetz. The Crew Reserves dropped to 2-7-0 on the year, while the Fire Reserves improved to 3-4-2.

The Crew Reserves play again this Sunday in New York. Now in its second year, the Reserve Division is a key component of Major League Soccer's drive to develop the stars of tomorrow in a professional, competitive atmosphere. Similar to last season, all teams will compete in a single table with a \$20,000 team bonus awarded to the team that finishes the season at the top of the table. Each team will play 12 Reserve Division games throughout the course of the season, with half of their games on the road and half at home. No team will play any other team more than twice. Last year marked the inaugural season of the Reserve Division, developed by Major League Soccer in partnership with adidas as a key component of the *Generation adidas* program. SZETELA OUT AGAIN, HURTS RIGHT KNEE IN 8/8 EXHIBITION

Midfielder Danny Szetela hurt his right knee in The Crew's exhibition in Pittsburgh on 8/8 and is out. He had just returned to the field on 7/22 for the first time since April 15 when he broke a bone in his left foot. He missed 16 MLS games while his foot was healing. He came on as a substitute in the 82nd minute.

THE CREW'S 18-GAME MLS SINGLE-SEASON UNBEATEN STREAK RECORD REMAINS IN TACT AFTER D.C. LOSS AT RSL ENDS THEIR RUN AT 14 GAMES

The Crew's 18-game Major League Soccer single-season unbeaten streak record remains in tact after Real Salt Lake knocked off D.C. United, 2-1, on Saturday, July 29. Unaited had gone 14 games without a loss this season, last losing on May 6.

Columbus went 18 games (8-0-10) without a loss to finish the 2004 season and stretched the overall record to 19 games after winning their first regular season game to start the 2005 season.

ROZENTAL TALLIES HIS SECOND GOAL OF THE YEAR

Midfielder Sebastian Rozental tallied his second goal of the year in The Crew's 2-1 loss to Real Salt Lake on 8/16. Both of his goals have come from penalty kicks.

CREW TIES MLS RECORD FOR GOALKEEPERS APPEARING IN A SEASON

When goalkeeper Bill Gaudette appeared in The Crew's game on 7/22 vs. Los Angeles he became the fifth goalkeeper to play in a game this season for The Crew, tying a Major League Soccer single-season record. The record is also held by the Miami Fusion, who used five goalkeepers during the 1998 season.

Gaudette made his first appearance on 7/9 in the Crew Reserve game since breaking a bone in his right thumb on 4/8 in Colorado. Gaudette and Noah Palmer are the only healthy goalkeepers on The Crew roster.

Palmer (9 games), Jon Busch (8), Gaudette (3), Andy Gruenebaum (1) and Dan Popik (1) have all seen action this season, while Dominic Jakubek was called up but did not see any action. Busch and Walker are both out for the year with injuries and Gruenebaum is still out with a broken right hand suffered in practice on 5/19. Prior to his season with Kiel, he played with 1.FC Union Berlin in the 2004/2005 season and with Arminia Bielefeld II in the 2003/2004 season. He notched 12 goals in 32 games for Union Berlin and 16 goals in 20 games for Bielefeld.

Coiner played at the University of San Diego from 1999-2002, twice earning second-team All-American honors and being named West Coast Conference Player of the Year in 2000 and 2002. He left USD as the school's second all-time leading goal scorer with 49 goals, second only to Guillermo Jara's 51.

The Crew announced on July 11 that the club has acquired forward Marc Burch from the Los Angeles Galaxy in exchange for The Crew's second-round pick in the 2007 Supplemental Draft. To make room for Burch the club waived midfielder Dayton O'Brien.

Burch appeared in three games for the Galaxy after being selected in the second round (24th overall) of the 2006 MLS SuperDraft. The Cincinnati native played three years at Evansville before transferring to Maryland for his senior season, helping the Terrapins capture the 2005 College Cup championship by scoring the game-winning goal. GAVEN TALLIES HIS FIRST CREW GOAL, NOTCHES FIRST PK OF HIS CAREER

Midfielder Eddie Gaven tallied his first career Crew goal in The Crew's 1-1 tie at Houston on 7/4 when he buried a penalty kick in the second half to tie the game after Joseph Ngwenya drew a penalty kick. Not only was it his first goal for The Crew, but it was his first career goal scored by penalty kick out of his 17 career goals.

GAVEN BECOMES YOUNGEST CREW PLAYER TO EVER SCORE A GOAL

When Eddie Gaven scored on a penalty kick in The Crew's 1-1 tie at Houston on 7/4, he became the youngest player to score a goal for Columbus at 19 years, 252 days.

RETIZ TALLIES FIRST CAREER GOAL

Midfielder Jose Retiz tallied his first career in The Crew's 1-1 tie vs. Chivas on 6/24. Retiz took a short pass from Eddie Gaven and unleashed a long-range blast that deflected off the Chivas defender and found the net in the 12th minute.

KAMARA NOTCHES SECOND GOAL OF THE YEAR

Forward Kei Kamara tallied his second goal of the year in The Crew's 1-1 tie vs. New England on 6/21. Kamara came on as a second half substitute in the 67th minute and scored the equalizer in the 86th minute.

KOTSCHAU TALLIES GAME-WINNER VS. FC DALLAS

Defender Ritchie Kotschau tallied the game-winning goal in the 89th minute of The Crew's 2-1 win at Dallas on 6/3. Kotschau's late goal proved to be crucial as Carlos Ruiz scored in the 1st minute of stoppage time for Dallas. It was Kotschau's 10th career regular season goal, his first since 2003. He has one career playoff goal, which he also scored in Dallas in 2005.

After guiding The Crew to a 7-6-3 record as Interim Coach the last half of the 2005 season, assistant coach Robert Warzycha received the first multi-year contract for a Crew assistant coach in club history.

FIRST GRABAVOY AND THEN NGWENYA TWICE

After being acquired in a trade from L.A. on May 12, midfielder Ned Grabavoy and forward Joseph Ngwenya paid immediate dividends. The pair scored in the three games right after being acquired, with Ngwenya notching goals in a 5-1 loss at D.C. on 5/31 and a 1-1 tie vs. D.C. on 5/20, and Grabavoy scoring the game-winner vs. Colorado on 5/13, just a day after the trade to Columbus. The Crew acquired Grabavoy and Ngwenya from L.A. in exchange for midfielder Kyle Martino and forward John Wolyniec. To clear a Senior International spot on The Crew roster for Ngwenya, The Crew waived Duncan Oughton. Ngwenya and Grabavoy were both drafted by Schmid in the 2004 MLS SuperDraft, Ngwenya in the first round, 3rd overall, and Grabavoy in the second round, 14th overall.

WALKER PLACED ON SEASON-ENDING INJURED RESERVE

The Columbus Crew announced today that goalkeeper Jonny Walker has been placed on the season-ending injured reserve due to a lower back injury. Walker suffered an annular tear in the L5/S1 lumbar disc in his lower back last November while in Columbus for the Crew mini-camp.

CREW ACQUIRES PALMER FROM RSL AFTER BUSCH INJURY

The Crew announced on May 24 that it has acquired goalkeeper Noah Palmer from Salt Lake in exchange for its first round draft pick in the 2007 MLS Supplemental Draft and the rights to Duke Hashimoto. Palmer was selected in the third round (25th overall) of the 2005 MLS Supplemental Draft, but missed the 2005 season after shoulder surgery. He has not appeared in any first-team games for RSL this year but has appeared in one reserve game, notching a shutout win. He was a four-year starter at Maryland and is the school's all-time shutouts leader with 34. He ended his career with a 0.86 goals-against average, including a school, single-season record goals-against average of 0.59 as a junior. He was a two-time, second-team All-ACC selection. Hashimoto was drafted in the fourth round of the 2006 MLS SuperDraft but was not currently under contract and did not join The Crew until early May after finishing his degree at SMU.

TWO ROOKIES MAKE PROFESSIONAL DEBUTS IN CREW SEASON OPENER

Rookie's Kei Kamara and Brandon Moss made their professional debuts in The Crew season opener at K.C. on 4/1. Kamara was selected in the 1st round (9th overall) of the MLS SuperDraft and Moss in the third round (27th overall) of the MLS SuperDraft.

CREW SIGNS LEITCH, ZAYNER PLACED ON SEASON-ENDING IR

The Crew announced on 4/28 that it has signed defender Chris Leitch to a contract. The Crew did not have to waive a player to create a roster spot for Leitch due to placing rookie defender Jed Zayner on season-ending injured reserve. Leitch's rights were initially acquired by The Crew on 3/28 as part of the Eddie Gaven for Edson Buddle trade with New York. Leitch, a five-year MLS veteran, started his MLS career with The Crew in 2002 after being drafted by the club in the fourth round of the MLS SuperDraft. He was traded to NY just prior to the start of the 2003 season and played with New York through last year. The Pickerington, native has appeared in 85 games, 76 starts, and has tallied three assists in his career. He was also named the 2005 Defender of the Year for NY.

ROOKIE ZAYNER TEARS LEFT ACL AND LEFT KNEE CARTILAGE

Crew rookie defender Jed Zayner tore his left ACL and left knee cartilage in practice on April 4 and will be out indefinitely. Zayner was selected in the second round (13th overall) of the MLS SuperDraft.

CREW ACQUIRES HENDRICKSON FROM CHIVAS USA, WAIVES KITAMIRIKE

The Crew announced April 28 that it has acquired veteran defender Ezra Hendrickson from Chivas USA in exchange for a conditional pick in the 2007 MLS SuperDraft. To make room for Hendrickson on the roster, The Crew waived defender Joel Kitamirike. The ten-year MLS veteran had not appeared in any games for Chivas this season after starting 31 games for the club in 2005. The native of Layou, St. Vincent, has appeared in 206 MLS games in his career, including 177 starts. He has tallied 21 goals and 28 assists. Hendrickson has also seen action in 31 playoff games, starting 26, and has five goals and three assists. Hendrickson has helped two clubs capture MLS Cup titles, his first with Los Angeles in 2002 and again with D.C. in 2004. Besides Los Angeles (1997-2003), D.C. (2004) and Chivas (2005-2006), he has also played for New York (1997) and Dallas (2003). The 34-year-old has been a member of the Saint Vincent and the Grenadines national team since 1995 and has served as its captain on numerous occasions. Hendrickson attended Drake University in Des Moines, Iowa. Kitamirike was signed in the offseason but had appeared in just one game this season, playing 19 minutes as a substitute on April 15.

CREW STARTS TWO TEENAGERS FOR FIRST TIME IN CLUB HISTORY

When 18-year-old midfielder Danny Szetela and 19-year-old forward Eddie Gaven started in The Crew's home opener at Kansas City on 4/1, it was the first time in Crew history that two teenagers have started in the same game for the Black & Gold. When 19-year-old Crew defender Tim Ward came on as a second half substitute it was also the first time in team history that three teenagers have been on the field at the same time. The club previously had two teenagers play in the same game in 2004 when Szetela and Chad Marshall shared the field together.

CREW SIGNS AMERICAN MIDFIELDER THOMAS

The Crew announced on March 31 that the club has signed midfielder Jacob Thomas. Per league and team policies, contract terms are not disclosed. Thomas has been training with The Crew since Monday, March 27. Thomas, a Jonestown, Texas native, has played portions of the past eight seasons in Germany, most recently with VfB Lubeck in the German Third Division. Prior to his two-year stint with Lubeck, Thomas spent parts of six seasons with Eintracht Braunschweig in the German Second and Third Divisions. Thomas played one year at St. Louis University (1995) before joining the Austin Lone Stars of the USISL for the 1996 season. He was out of soccer for almost two years (1997-1998) before heading to Germany and joining Eintracht in October of 1998. He tallied 26 goals and played in more than 143 matches while in Germany.

CREW DEALS FOR GAVEN JUST PRIOR TO START OF 2006 SEASON

The Crew announced on March 28 that it has acquired midfielder Eddie Gaven and the rights to former Crew defender and Pickerington native Chris Leitch from the New York Red Bulls in exchange for forward Edson Buddle. Leitch is not currently under contract. The 19-year-old Gaven turned pro at the age of 16 and holds the New York team record for youngest player to play a game (16 years, 232 days) and youngest to score a goal (16 years, 253 days). In three years in New York, the Hamilton, N.J., native has played in 69 games (62 starts), and tallied 16 goals and 12 assists. In 2004, Gaven was selected a starter for the MLS All-Star game and was named to the MLS Best XI squad after tallying seven goals and seven assists. Gaven has appeared three times for the full U.S. National Team, making his National Team debut on July 11, 2004. He has also played for the U.S. at the U-23, U-20, U-17, U-16 and U-14 levels, including spots on the U.S. rosters for the (U-20) FIFA World Youth Championship in 2005, coached by Schmid, and the FIFA U-17 World Championship in 2003. Buddle, 24, appeared in 106 games for The Crew and notched 42 goals during his four seasons. Last season, Buddle netted nine goals and dished out two assists in 23 games played. A veteran of four MLS seasons, Leitch originally joined New York on March 13, 2003 in a trade with Columbus. He appeared in 72 regular season games for New York and notched three assists from the back line. He also garnered the 2005 New York Defender of the Year award. Leitch was waived by the NY on March 1, 2006, but when he was not selected in the waiver draft on March 3, his rights reverted back to the Red Bulls.

The Crew and ONN (Ohio News Network) have announced the 2006 local television broadcast schedule for The Crew.
